Be Considerate to Your Aged Parents

An 80-year-old man was seated on the sofa in his house along with his 45-year-old highly educated and well-settled son. Suddenly a crow perched on their window. The father asked his son, "What is this, son?" the son replied, "It is crow." After a few minutes, the father asked his son the second time: "What is this, son?" The son said, "Dad, I told you just now: it is crow!" After a little while, the older father again asked his son the third time, "Son, what is this?" This time, irritated, the son's tone was harsh. He said with a rebuff, "It is a crow, a crow, a crow!" After a while, the father again asked his son the fourth time, "What is this, son?" This time the son shouted at his father, "Why do you keep asking me the same question again and again?" I have told you so many times IT IS A CROW. Are you not able to understand?"

A little later the father got up from the sofa and went to his room and came back with an old tattered diary, which he had maintained since his only son was born. On opening a page, he asked his son to read that page. The son took the dairy in his hands and quietly read the following notation made by his dad when he himself was only three years old," Today my little son age three was sitting with me on the sofa, when a crow was sitting on the window. My son asked me 23 times what it was, and I replied to him all 23 times that IT WAS A CROW. I hugged him lovingly each time he asked me the same question again and again 23 times. I did not at all become irritated, I rather felt affection for my innocent son" The son, with tears in his eyes, sat down by the side of his dad and said, "Sorry, dad, thank you for the lesson you have taught me today!"

After many months of research, deliberation, and prayer, Bishop James P. Powers authorized the release of the names of clergy with substantiated allegations of abuse of a minor in the Diocese of Superior. This information is available on the Diocesan website www.catholicdos.org and was published in the November 24, 2022 edition of the Catholic Herald. The majority of names on this list are deceased and pose no further danger. Those who are living have been removed from all priestly ministry. Bishop Powers and his staff are aware that the publication of these names may move additional victims to come forward. The Diocese of Superior is open to receiving these calls.
