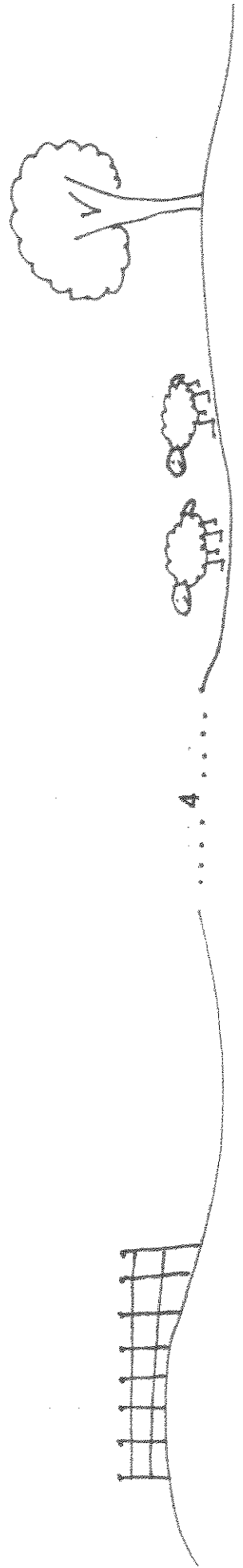


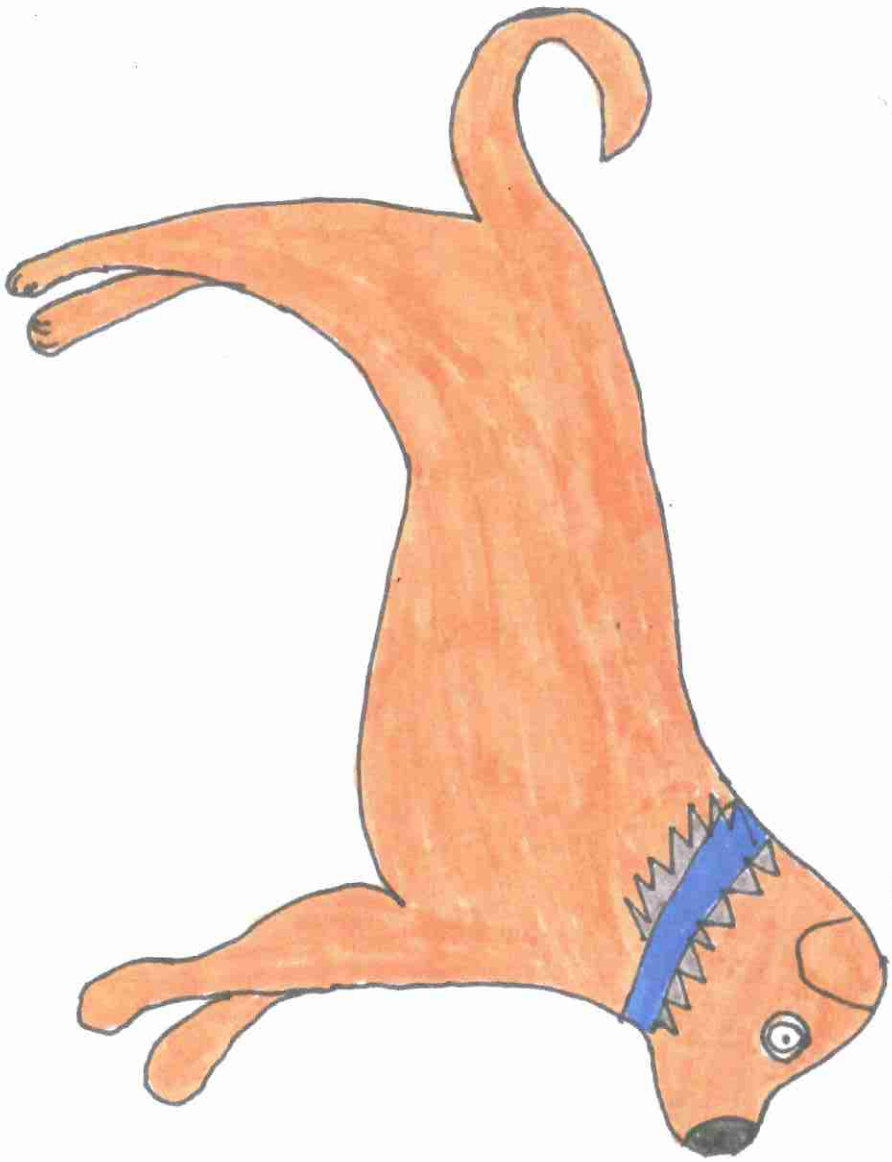
Once upon a time there was a dog named Bonesy who lived on a farm whose purpose was to protect a flock of sheep.





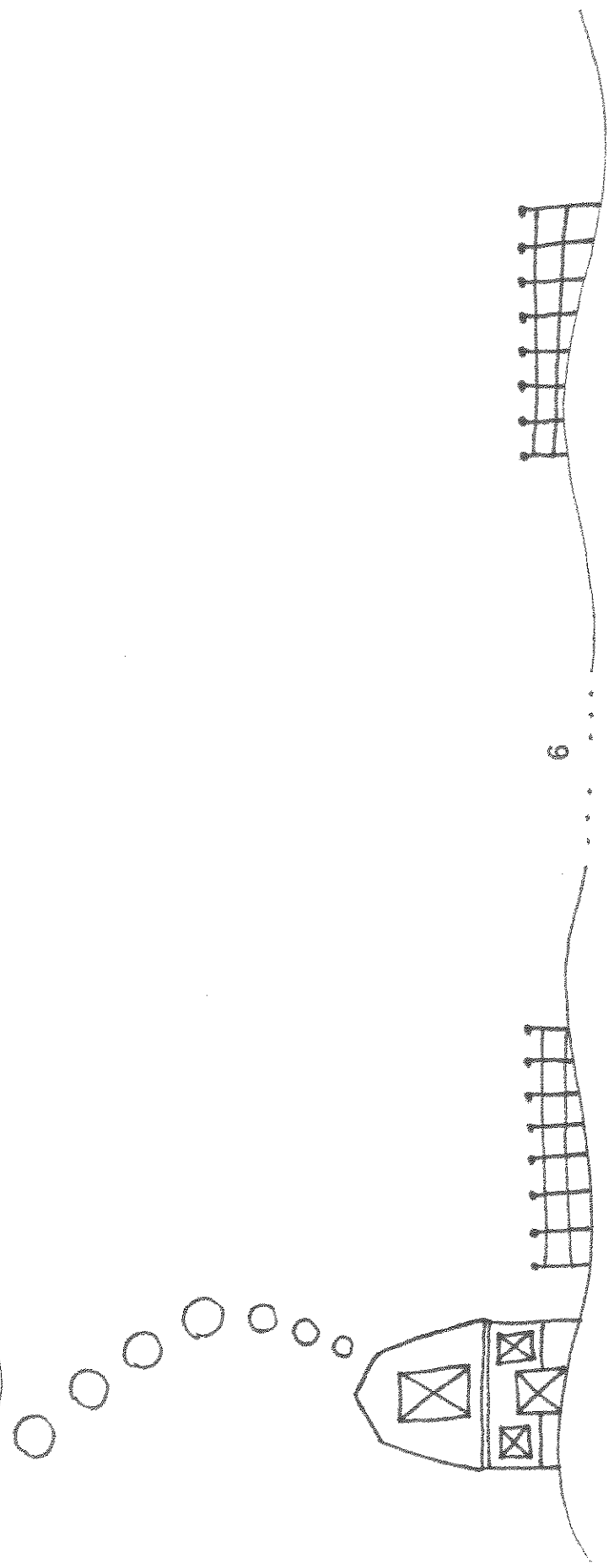
One day a wolf walked up and Bonesy growled to get the wolf to go away but the wolf just stood there not making a sound and then the wolf said I'm just looking for a friend.

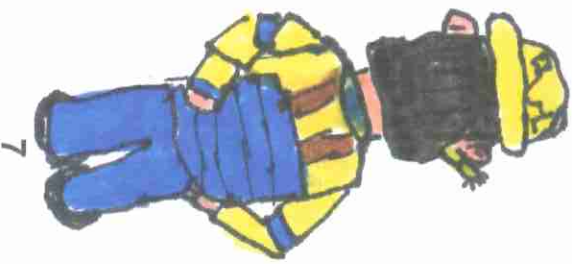




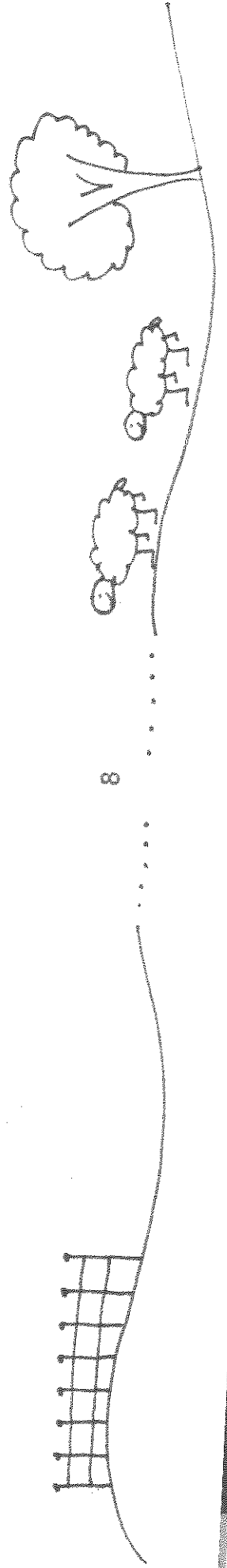

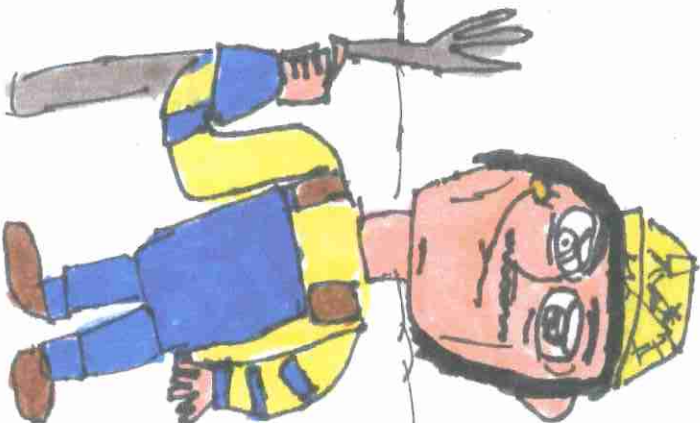
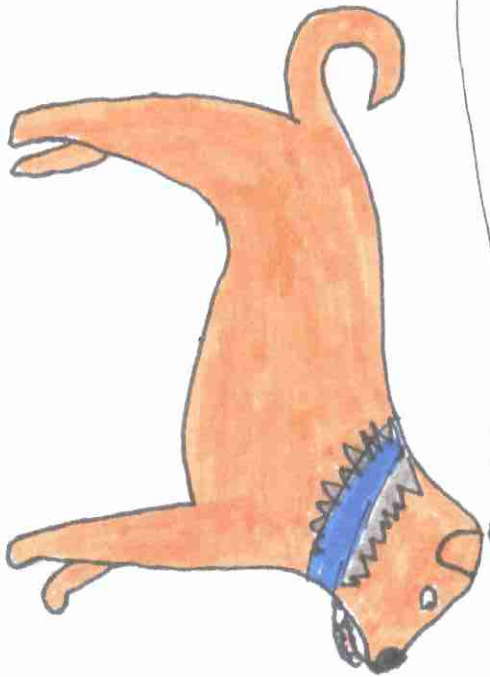
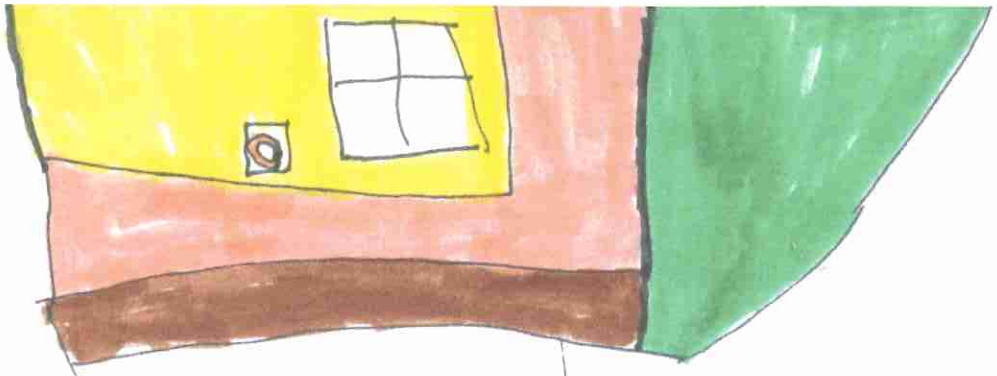
Bonesy thought in his head and said, "I could probably be his friend."



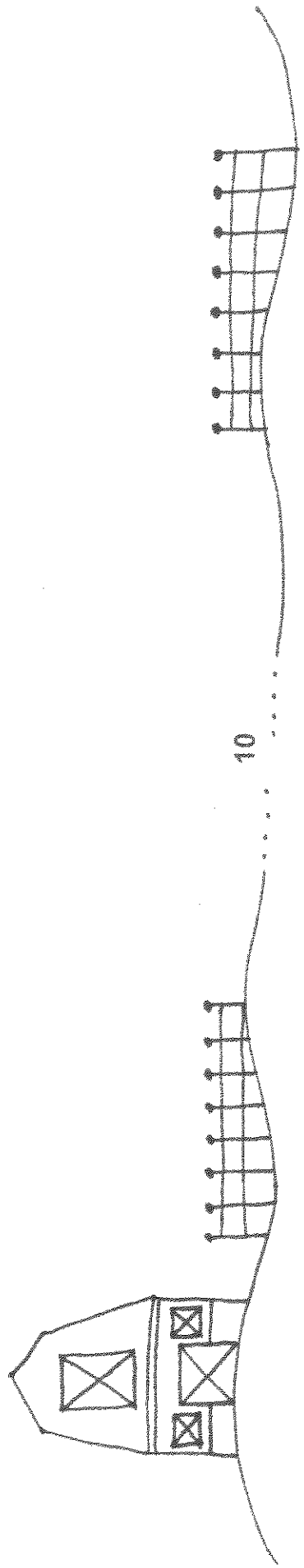


A few days later the farmer saw the wolf and saw that Bonesy wasn't harming the wolf and doing his job.



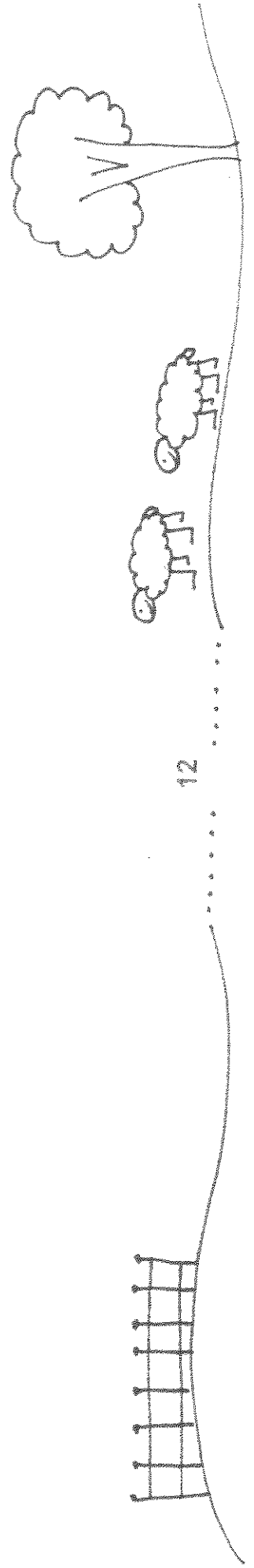


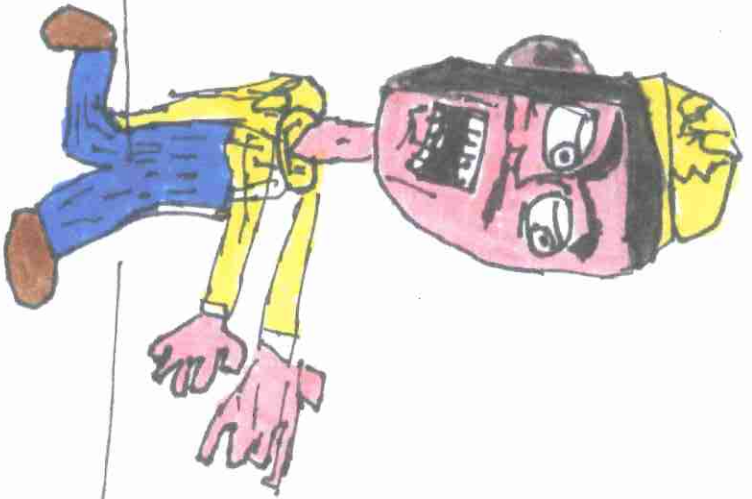
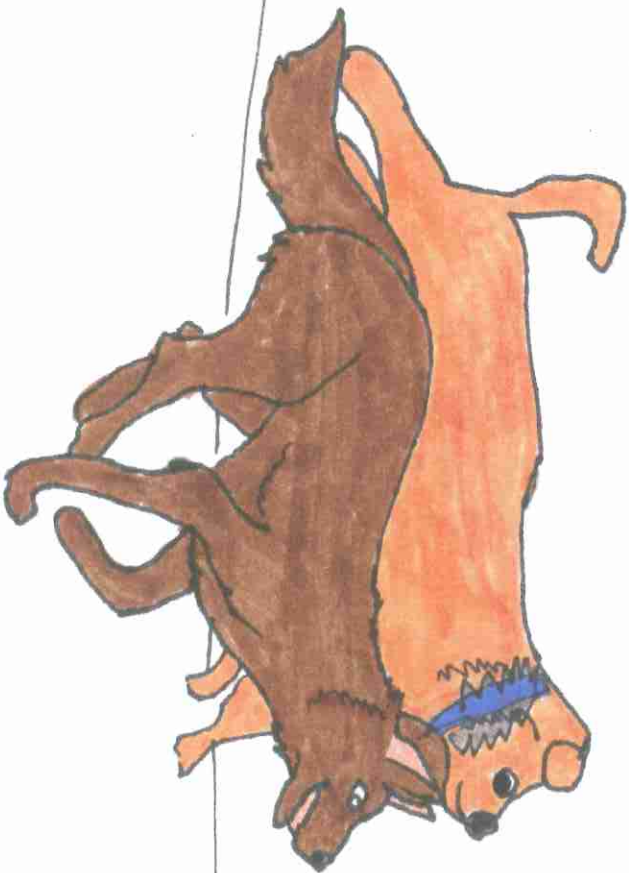
Then one day he got jealous so he tried to force Bonesy to stay in the house. Then he fought Bonesy.



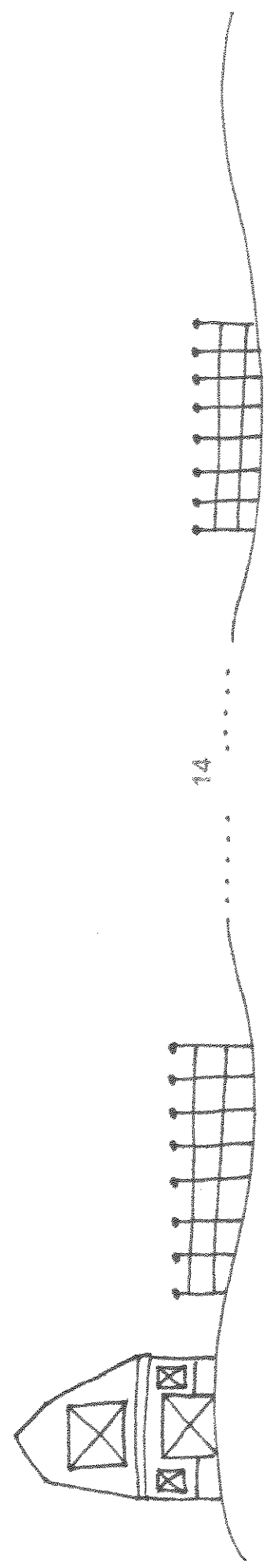


He looked up again and the wolf bit the farmer and then the wolf

Bonesy and the wolf ran at the farmer who chased after them but couldn't catch them.

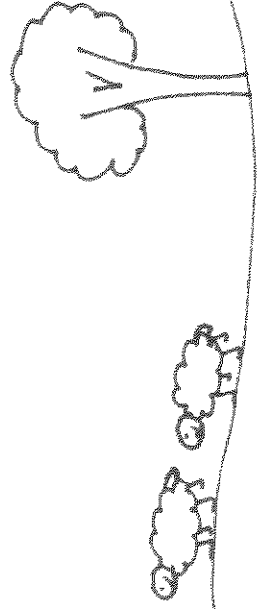
